TO: Delta Air Lines and Delta Connection Passengers:

SUBJECT: Guidelines to Transport Refrigerated Liquid Nitrogen (Dry Shipper)

Delta Air Lines allows transport of your liquid nitrogen dry shipper provided it is in accordance with the International Air Transportation Association (IATA) Dangerous Goods Regulation 2.3.A:

2.3.A - Insulated Packages Containing Refrigerated Liquid Nitrogen (Dry Shipper):

Insulated packaging containing refrigerated liquid nitrogen fully absorbed in a porous material containing only non-dangerous goods.

Carry-On Baggage:

You are able to carry your Dry Shipper container onto the aircraft as long as it conforms to the Delta Air Lines carryon baggage size regulation of 22" x 14" x 9" (or 56 x 36 x 23 cm).

Checked Baggage:

You are able to carry your Dry Shipper container as Checked Baggage as long as it conforms to the Delta Air Lines checked baggage size regulation of 50 pounds (23 kg) or less and 62 inches (157 cm) when you total length+width+height .

Bags that do not meet our **size and weight restrictions** will require special handling and additional fees.

When checking-in for your flights you need to notify the agent you are traveling with the Dry Shipper. The agent will need to do a visual check of the Dry Shipper to confirm it is not damaged and in good working condition.
